
We will explore hidden coves, historic shipwrecks, and bustling Cape Fur seal colonies. Glide over Atlantic swells, past towering cliffs and granite islands, and spot humpback whales or Heaviside's dolphins. For the adventurous, snorkel in majestic kelp forests to encounter endemic shy sharks, curious fur seals, or elusive penguins. You will be guided by passionate local wildlife experts who will reveal the stories of the Cape.

Booking & Cancellation Policy

Trips are weather-dependent. If we need to reschedule or cancel we aim to do this 24 hours before departure, but reserve the right to cancel at short notice if needed. Full refund if weather causes a cancellation. All trips cancellations within 48 hours, no-shows, or late arrivals will receive no refund or change of date. All cancellations prior to 48 hours will incur a 10% admin fee.







Can I snorkel on the safari?

Yes! For confident swimmers there is the option to snorkel. Equipment included upon request. Sizes need to be provided.

Will we snorkel with Cape fur seals?

It is likely that we encounter cape fur seals in the kelp forest on the Ocean Safari. We will not snorkel at the fur seal colonies as this is where the highest chance of encountering aggressive or sick seals may be.

Facilities on arrival?

Will we see whales and dolphins?

Heaviside and Dusky dolphins are very common.

November - Febuary is the the Humpback whale supergroup feeding season, where you can see them on the safari. Common dolphins and Southern right whales can also be seen occasionally. We are not a specific whale-watching boat so will stick to the appropriate guidelines.

Who will be the Marine Guide?

All our guides will provide a wonderful experience. If you would like to book Steve specifically for a trip there is an additional fee to confirm him, if available.

Do I need to be able to swim?

If you plan to snorkel you must be able to swim. If you are nervous our guides will assist you and make you comfortable. There is plenty to see from the boat without snorkeling.

What if I am prone to sea sickness?

Sea sickness may be a problem for some, please bring your own medication.

What do I need to bring?


We recommend you bring sunscreen, a hat, and a waterproof jacket. Snorkelers need to bring a bathing suit and towel.
